**Pope Francis' January Prayer Intention:**

*For true human fraternity – We pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution; may their own rights and dignity be recognized, which originate from being brothers and sisters in the human family.*

From today's Reading

**Jer 1:4-5,17-19/ 1Cor 12:31-13.13/ Luke 4:21-30**

The First Reading tells of the call commissioning of the prophet Jeremiah. Jeremiah never wanted to be a prophet and was overwhelmed by the sheer burden of it. He stands out as a lonely figure whose mission seemed to have failed. He is the supreme example, until Jesus, of the triumph of failure.

The Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's reading. We see the reaction to the homily Jesus gave in the synagogue at Nazareth. The people can't believe that the words of Isaiah could apply to him, the humble son of Joseph. On hearing that the benefits they have rejected will be offered to the Gentiles, the people rise up in fury and attempt to do away with Jesus. This foreshadows the ultimate fate of Jesus: but his hour had not yet come.

St Paul had been speaking of gifts and charisms. But here (Second Reading) he stresses the supreme importance of love. Without love all these gifts are useless.

**Mandatory mask order:**

Effective today, **Friday, September 17, masks must be worn in every indoor public space.** This means that **places of worship will need to ensure that all attending are wearing masks.**

Masking exemptions can be found on the Public Health Order. The following would apply in places of worship:

- 4(c)(i) Individuals aged two and under;
  - 4(c)(ii) Individuals aged three to twelve who are not reasonably able to wear a face covering;
  - 4(c)(iii) Subject to subsection (g), individuals who, in the determination of a health professional, are unable to wear a face covering due to a particular medical condition and have received written confirmation of same in accordance with subsection (f);
  - 4(c)(iv) Individuals who, due to cognitive impairment, an intellectual disability, or a severe mental health condition, are unable to understand the requirement;
  - 4(c)(vi) Individuals who are leading a service, ceremony, or other public event while speaking from a podium, lectern, platform, stage, desk or other standing or seating area dedicated to speaking, but only when the individual can maintain a distance of three metres from other individuals;
  - 4(c)(vii) Individuals playing a woodwind, brass, or other instrument operated by breath, but only if they can maintain a distance of three metres from other individuals, as measured from the mouth or opening/bell end of the instrument, whichever is closest, to another individual while playing;
- Individuals may remove their mask briefly in order to consume the eucharist.

Proof of vaccination:

Places of worship are exempt from the proof of vaccination policy.

**In summary:**

Please continue to be cautious and prudent. Encourage regular hand sanitizing. Physical distancing is not required but is encouraged. Physical touching (shaking hands, hugging, etc...) is discouraged. There are no indications yet whether there will be limits on serving food or beverages in places of worship.

**Pastor's Desk – The Order of Mass series**

**ENTRANCE:**

- a. After a processional hymn, a priest makes a sign of the cross. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

**Where does the sign of cross come from?**

The sign of the cross means: + gathering together in the catacomb, house to house, and cemetery— the Eucharist celebrated and shared with each other — "Jesus' death and resurrection." Then the sign of Cross merged with the trinity formula of baptism. Trace this sign before baptize a person, profess faith, make + before eating, the formula of absolving of the sacrament of Reconciliation. In 313, Constantine II declared a verdict— Christians were celebrated Mass in public and the churches building was built on the ground where the martyr's blood poured out down there...

Finally, we received the sign of Cross at baptism and carry it on the whole life.
