Pope Francis' February Prayer Intention:

For religious sisters and consecrated women – We pray for religious sisters and consecrated women; thanking them for their mission and their courage; may they continue to find new responses to the challenges of our times.

From today's Reading

Is 6:1-2a,3-8/ 1Cor 15:1-11/ Luke 5:1-11

The First Reading tells us of the call of Isaiah to the ministry of prophecy. In a vision in the Temple God reveals himself to Isaiah as the All-holy One. The vision evokes in Isaiah a sense of his own sinfulness. But then, cleansed of his sins, he responds without hesitation to the divine call. This prepares us for the Gospel which deals with the call of the first disciple; here again we see that it is God who takes the initiative, and also the total response he requires.

The miraculous catch of fish convinces Peter of the holiness of Jesus. This evokes in him a sense of their own sinfulness and unworthiness, so much so that he asks Jesus to depart from him. Peter has not yet grasped the fact that it was to call sinners that Jesus came, to call them away from sin to a new way of life. Nevertheless, at the word of Jesus, Peter and his companions leave everything and follow him. The phrase 'they left everything' show the importance for Luke of detachment from possessions.

The Second Reading stresses the central belief of Christianity — the resurrection of Jesus. Paul declares that, in spite of his unworthiness, he is a witness to the resurrection.

Mandatory mask order:

Effective today, **Friday, September 17, masks must be worn in every indoor public space.** This means that **places of worship will need to ensure that all attending are wearing masks.**

Masking exemptions can be found on the Public Health Order. The following would apply in places of worship:

- 4(c)(i) Individuals aged two and under;
 - 4(c)(ii) Individuals aged three to twelve who are not reasonably able to wear a face covering;
 - 4(c)(iii) Subject to subsection (g), individuals who, in the determination of a health professional, are unable to wear a face covering due to a particular medical condition and have received written confirmation of same in accordance with subsection (f);
 - 4(c)(iv) Individuals who, due to cognitive impairment, an intellectual disability, or a severe mental health condition, are unable to understand the requirement;
 - 4(c)(vi) Individuals who are leading a service, ceremony, or other public event while speaking from a podium, lectern, platform, stage, desk or other standing or seating area dedicated to speaking, but only when the individual can maintain a distance of three metres from other individuals;
 - 4(c)(vii) Individuals playing a woodwind, brass, or other instrument operated by breath, but only if they can maintain a distance of three metres from other individuals, as measured from the mouth or opening/bell end of the instrument, whichever is closest, to another individual while playing;
- Individuals may remove their mask briefly in order to consume the eucharist.

Proof of vaccination:

Places of worship are exempt from the proof of vaccination policy.

In summary:

Please continue to be cautious and prudent. Encourage regular hand sanitizing. Physical distancing is not required but is encouraged. Physical touching (shaking hands, hugging, etc...) is discouraged. There are no indications yet whether there will be limits on serving food or beverages in places of worship.

- b. The Lord be with you. And with your Spirit (and also with you) Lk 1:28. Angel Gabriel came to Mary.... (Bible) (Bp-Peace be with you ‘Upper Room where the Apostles feared and Jesus appeared to them).
- c. Penitential Act: forms — asking for forgiveness to God and Brothers & Sisters before we celebrate the living word of God and the Eucharistic Banquet (let us give the sign of peace to each other. Firstly, this practice started from the monastery in Iceland areas. Monks confessed each other and then monks and superiors heard their confessions. They also read the gospel of Mark (ch. 6). A man emptied himself and repent to God. Secondly, early Christians followed Jesus and his disciples — Apostles. They failed while they practiced their faith. The word “lapse” described about them. They wanted to be back to a community. Thirdly, people wanted to convert to Jesus, they must prepare RCIA for three years before they might be baptized and immersed into water in a river.

The sacred liturgy collected all of ideas from the Gospel and traditions. They built the order of Mass now. (Next...)
