From today's Reading

2Macc 7:1-2,7,9-14++/ 2Thess 2:2.16-3.5/ Luke 20:27-38

The First Reading is taken from 2 Maccabees. A feature of this book is its confident teaching on the afterlife. Our readings tell (in part) the story of the martyrdom of a mother and her seven sons. This is an example of the resistance of the Jews against their conquerors. The woman and her sons drew their strength from faith in the resurrection of the just. And it is this latter idea which connects the reading with today's Gospel.

Jesus is drawn into the argument which went on between the Sadducees and the Pharisees regarding the resurrection. The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection; the Pharisees did. The Sadducee used the tactic of *reductio ad absurdum*.

Jesus used the insincere inquiry as an opportunity to deliver a genuine teaching. The first thing he did was to challenge the assumption that the afterlife is just a continuation of this life, with some extras thrown in. He made it clear that there is no comparison between this life and that of the resurrection.

Then he went on to use another argument to support belief in the resurrection of the dead. God is known as a God of the living. But he is also known as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. This means that the patriarchs must be still living.

As Christians our hope of resurrection is founded on the love God has shown us in Jesus (Second Reading). Nevertheless, the above readings will help to strengthen our faith as believers.
